Course Description

The Emergency & Safety Equipment Training (ESET) makes your crew recurrent on the A220 aircraft. It covers all required items for a recurrent as defined by Authority regulations. The course consists of emergency procedures and regulations to requalify the crew member in the understanding of the procedures and the performance of their duties in an emergency. The one-day training mixes a balanced content of theoretical and practical training and is designed as training for qualified and experienced pilots and cabin crew member on A220.

The course is based on the idea of a theoretical foundation, laid in the classroom, along with daily sessions on the state-of-the-art Cabin Crew Emergency Evacuation Trainer where – from simple door training to complex procedure training – the crew member will be qualified to handle any case that could happen on board. Further customization of training is possible upon operator's demand.
